LAWN RENOVATION STAGES	(1) Mow Lawn Short (1/2") (2) Power Rake (3) Clean off debris	(4) Seed (5) Fertilize (6) Cover seed with straw - maintain mulch cover	(7) Water - Probably most important step. Water morning & noon with oscillating sprinkler until grass seed is up. Then water every 5 - 7 days.
